

NDPP Checklist

Supporting Your Conversations with Patients

When discussing NDPP with eligible patients, please ensure the following checklist is covered to support successful patient engagement:

1. Referral Process: Are patients aware that once referred, they should expect contact from Xyla, the provider of the NDPP in your area?

2. Available Pathways: Are they informed about the available pathways?

- Face-to-Face Groups (local community)
- Tailored-Remote Service (TRS) for those with visual or hearing impairments, alternative language requirements or a history of gestational diabetes.
- Digital 1:1 Coaching, via our digital partner Oviva

3. Programme Length &

Commitment: Are patients aware of the programme length and how many sessions they are committing to?

TOP TIP: the programme is approximately 20 hours spread over 9-months; it involves 14 educational sessions including an end of programme review.

4. Service Overview: Are patients clear about the NDPP's purpose and content?

Here's what you could say...

'NDPP aims to help reduce an individual's risk of developing Type 2 Diabetes by promoting healthy lifestyle adjustments. It provides structured educational support covering; nutritional advice, strategies to improve physical activity, stress management and sleep routine guidance.'

5. Suitability & Motivation: Is the programme suitable for the patient, and are they motivated to participate at the time of referral?
